# Land & Labor Acknowledgement Part 1

---

The Community Collaborative would like to acknowledge that we are currently living on the traditional territories of Coast Salish people and other Native peoples who have lived here for many generations and who continue to be systematically erased by policies and practices that remove their histories from this place.

We acknowledge and honor the sovereignty of Indigenous peoples in the North America and in the Island Territories of the United States over their languages, cultures and lands.

We will collectively labor to center Indigenous humanity and their continued struggles for justice in stewarding the health and wellness of their communities.

# Land & Labor Acknowledgement Part 2

---

We also acknowledge this country has been made possible by the labor of enslaved African peoples and their descendants who suffered the horror of trafficking, slavery, Jim Crow, imprisonment, police brutalities and many other harms we continue to see today through anti-Black sentiment.

We recognize the history of Washington state as complicit with the racist ideology of White supremacy. This persists in present-day racial realities privileging Whites while oppressing BIPOC communities.

**We are committed to uplifting the voices, experiences, histories, and contributions of Indigenous and descendants of enslaved peoples.**

UU. sobre sus idiomas, culturas y tierras y trabajaremos colectivamente para centrar la humanidad indígena y sus continuas luchas por la justicia en la administración de la salud y el bienestar de sus comunidades.

# Reconocimiento de Tierra y Trabajo Parte 2

También reconocemos que este país ha sido posible gracias al trabajo de los pueblos africanos esclavizados y sus descendientes que sufrieron el horror de la trata, la esclavitud, Jim Crow, el encarcelamiento, la brutalidad policial y muchos otros daños que seguimos viendo hoy a través del sentimiento anti-negro.

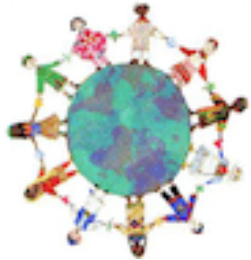

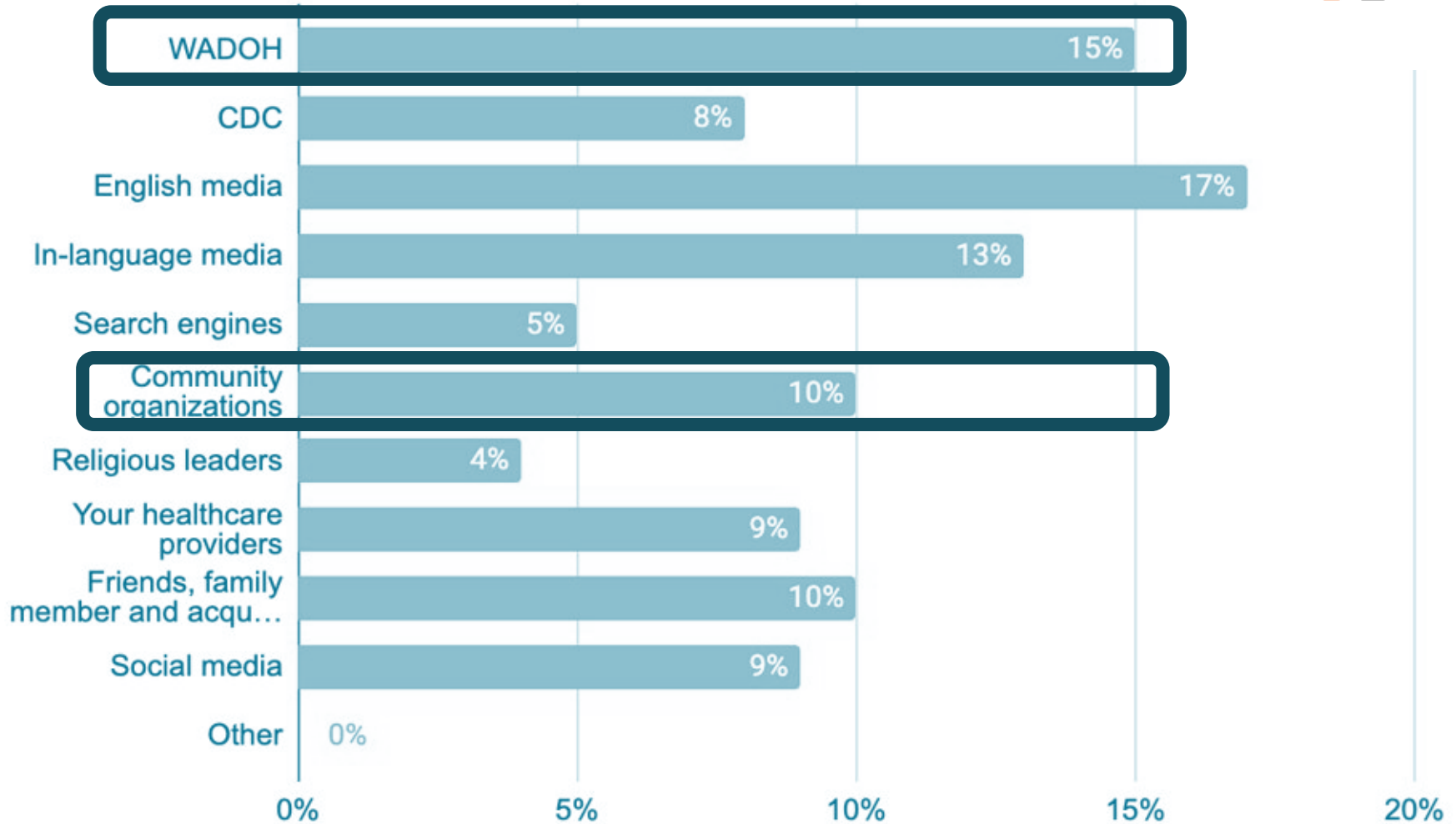

- ✓ **SB 5580** – improving maternal health outcomes
- ✓ **HB 1608** – expanding access to anaphylaxis medications in schools
- ✓ **SB 5821** – audio-only telemedicine
- ✓ **HB 2295** – hospital at-home services



# Health Workforce

---

- ✓ **HB 2247** – addressing behavioral health provider shortages
- ✓ **SB 5184** – creating licensure for anesthesiologist assistants
- ✓ **SB 5940** – creating a medical assistant – EMT certification
- ✓ **HB 1946** – creating a WA health corps behavioral health scholarship program





# Behavioral Health

---

- ✓ **SB 5853** – expanding crisis relief centers for minors
- ✓ **SB 5920** – lifting certificate of need requirements for psychiatric hospitals and beds
- ✓ **SB 6251** - coordinating regional behavioral crisis response services



## Climate/Environment (if time allows)

- ✓ **HB 1551** – reducing lead in cookware
- ✓ **SB 5931** – reducing 6PPD in vehicle tires

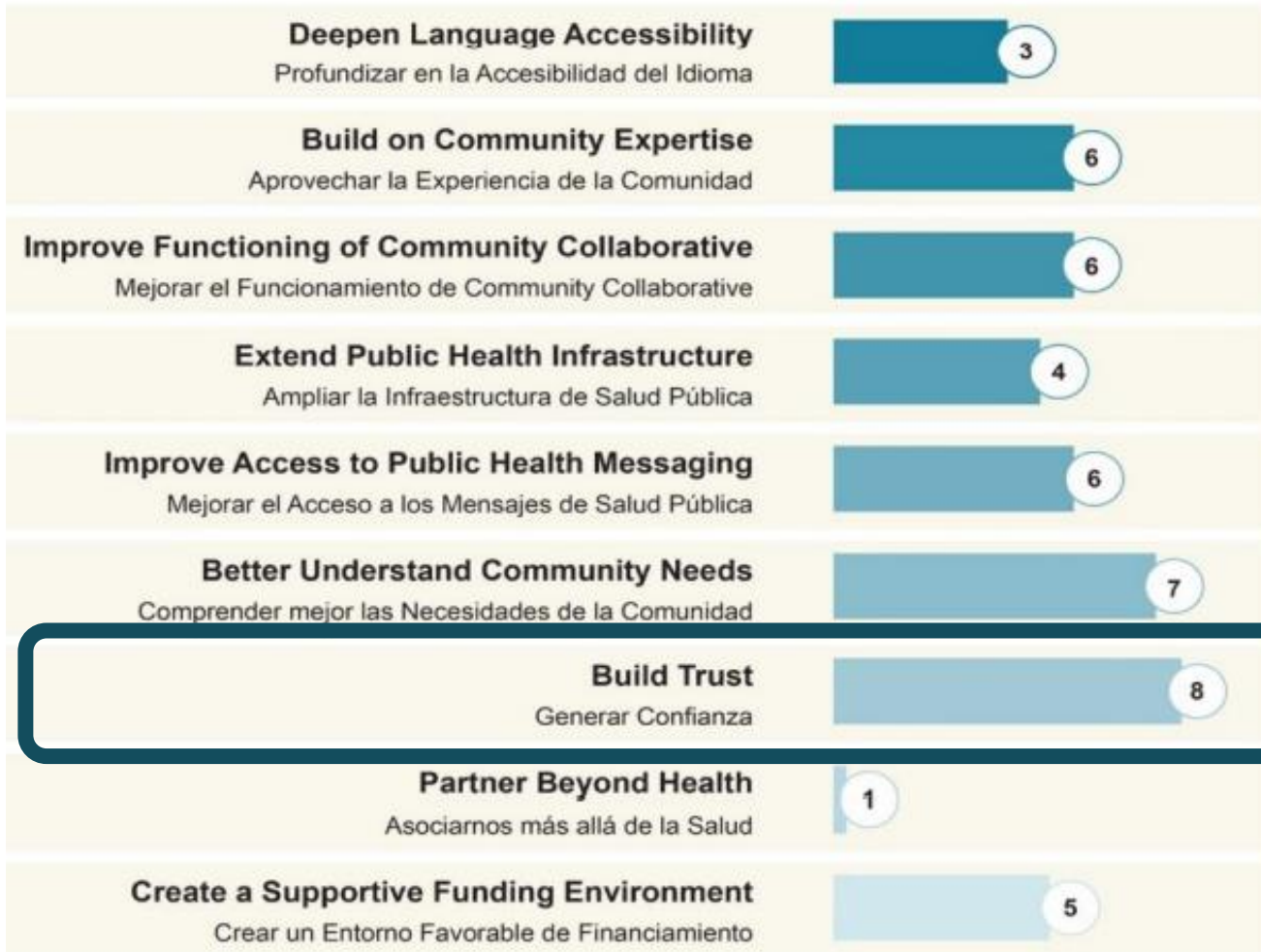

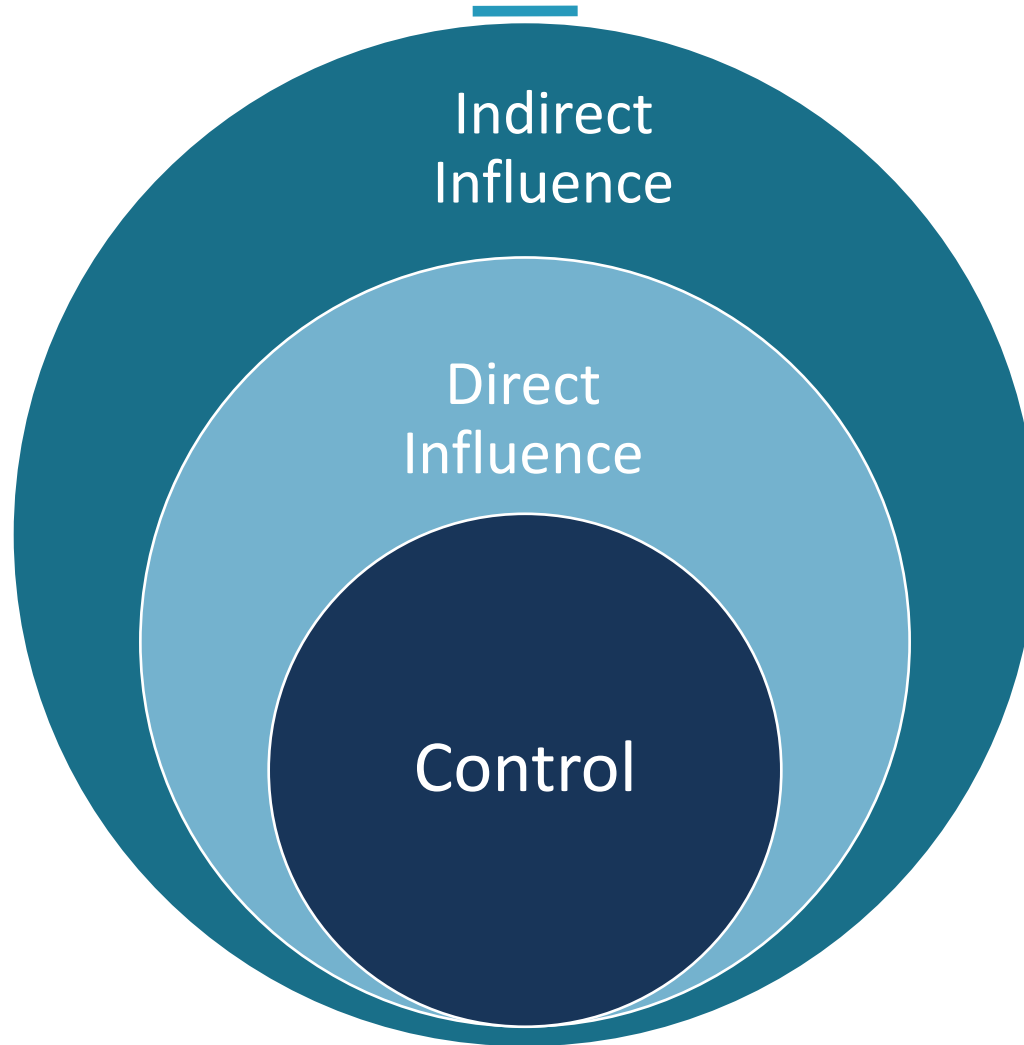
